

If you could choose an animal for a class pet what would it be? I would choose a guinea pig because they are really cute. They are also easy to take care of and good with kids.


If you could only use one emoji what would you choose?

Taher Recipe of the Month Strawberry Spinach Mint Feta Salad

What you need...

Dressing

1 Orange, juiced

3 Tbsp olive oil

2 Tbsp apple cider vinegar

1/2 Tbsp honey

to taste salt and pepper

Salad

6 oz. baby spinach 1/4 cup chopped mint

1/2 cup strawberries, quartered

1/4 cup feta cheese crumbles

Nutrition Snapshot: about 1 serving (recipe makes 3 servings)

215 calories, 17g total fat, 4g sat. fat, 305mg sodium, 12g carbohydrate, 3g fiber, 17mg cholesterol, 5g protein, 8g sugar



What to do...

Dressing

- 1. Juice the orange
- 2. Whisk together all ingredients and set aside

Salad

- Combine spinach, mint and strawberries
- 2. Whisk the dressing just prior to serving and toss with spinach mixture
- 3. Sprinkle feta cheese crumbles on top

Claim Your Wisconsin Private School Tuition Tax Deduction

Tax Day is on April 15, 2019. Remember to claim your state private K-12 school tuition tax deduction!

There is a silver lining to the dreaded tax deadline for private school parents. Thanks to advocacy by the Wisconsin Council of Religious & Independent Schools (WCRIS), our state law allows Wisconsin parents to deduct private kindergarten through 12th grade school tuition on their taxes.

Regardless of income, parents and legal guardians are eligible for a maximum deduction of \$4,000 per child in grades kindergarten through eighth grade and \$10,000 per child in ninth through 12th grade. Students transitioning from eighth to ninth grade are eligible for both deductions.

If you have questions about a specific circumstance, WCRIS recommends contacting a certified tax accountant for additional assistance. Learn more about this from the <u>Wisconsin Council of Religious and Independent Schools</u>.




