

School Safety Grant!


Siena Catholic Schools of Racine received \$66,948 from the Wisconsin Department of Justice this month, adding to the lengthy list of schools taking a slice of \$100 million in designated funding for school safety.

The grants are part of the department's School Safety Initiative, set up in the spring after the deadly school shooting in Parkland, Fla. Grant funds will be used for building safety improvements such as shatter resistant film on main entrances, securing building entryways, telephones in all classrooms and more.

The program is NOT related to the SCHOOL CHOICE program and an application must be filled out to receive the benefit as it is not automatic. Student confidentiality is protected in the lunch line.
