# PARTNERING WITH OUR COMMUNITY

"Living, Loving, and Learning our Faith" is more than our mission; our identity as a Catholic school is woven into every aspect of school life. One of those aspects is volunteering in our community. St. Rita's students have the opportunity to volunteer at St. Monica's senior living and residential facility throughout the school year. Students have the opportunity to play games, sing songs, make cards, and visit with the seniors. Additionally, our school also supports the Homeless Assistance Leadership Organization (HALO). Students make and donate fleece blankets and the staff prepares and serves a meal.

#### HISTORICAL SNAPSHOT

St. Rita opened in September of 1929, under the direction of two Racine Dominicans. St. Rita opened with seventy students under the direction of the two Dominican sisters from St. Catherine's Convent. Parishioners came from 15 different nationalities and the first pastor, Father Alpius Reuter, worked in 9 languages to communicate with the community. Through the efforts of Father Reuter, the name was changed from Ives to St. Rita.

In 1952, the parish purchased the North Racine School (now Lathrop Furniture on HWY 32) to accommodate the growing school enrollment. Three years later, the first five rooms of the current school building were completed and occupied by students in grades one through four. The following year, grades five through eight were added. In 1966, the gym, cafeteria and science rooms completed the school.

In 2021, early childhood grades, known as 3K and 4K increased St. Rita's enrollment. St. Rita's enrollment is approximately 220 students in grades 3K, 4K, Kindergarten through grade eight. We have generations of families attending our school and the families are always proud to share their stories. Many are proud to come back and provide service to our students and community. We love to learn how St. Rita's played a role in their lives.
